ILLAWARRA RACES OURS AGAIN

Peter also filed the following.

On Staurday August 18 our ski team competed in the Brian Donegan Illawarra Inter club races, staged at Blue Cow on a post card day. The alpine event was held in the morning with the cross country following in the afternoon.

In the alpine event competitors have 2 runs each with the best aggregate time winning.

Graeme Williams won the event with a time of 68.13 seconds. Graeme's first run beat the pace setter's time, (a great achievement).

Helmut Zeller came in second with a time of 70.46 seconds setting himself up nicely to defend the combined individual champion trophy which he won last year.

With Peter and Robert McCulloch finishing in the top 10 we took out the alpine team event for only the second time in its history, Illawarra Alpine having won it every other year. What a start to the day!

As you can guess our biggest challenge for the cross country and the combined was going to come from Illawarra Alpine who were still smarting over their relegation to 3rd place behind IMBAC in the alpine event.

Illawarra Alpine was a very formidable outfit, containing Mike Edmonson, the Australian 15km champion plus three other competent racers. In 14 years they have only lost this event twice, both times to Lysaghts. Illawarra's pride was on the line here but one man doesn't make a team and although we couldn't beat Mike, we could beat their team.

Well, it's now history our team of Friedl Bartsch, Frank Zeller, Helmut Zeller and Ben Salon did it for the second year running by the closest of margins. Just 10 seconds separated first and second.

By taking out both the alpine and the cross country we secured for only the second time (the first being last year,) the combined trophy. To win this trophy is a great honour for the club and it's members, especially since Illawarra Alpine had held it since its' inception 16 years ago. This was better than the Americas Cup

because we held it and Bondy lost it. Well maybe it wasn't 140 years but it felt like it.

Just think, we are now Illawarra Teams Champions in the Alpine, Cross country, and Combined as well as having the individual Alpine Champion Graeme Williams, the Individual Combined Champion Helmut Zeller, and the individual Female Cross Country Champion in Jane Livingstone. Jane beat most of the boys home which is not good for the ego.

If this has made you keen to compete, just have a run on the Ski Star and pass your time and the pace setter's time on to me. If you are a budding cross country skier, have a race in any cross country event (except the pub to pub) and forward your times.

A special thanks must go to all our reserves, our officials and our cheer squad. Without you we wouldn't have won these events.

On a final note, if we want to continue winning we have to encourage our juniors. They are our future racers so let's get behind them and give them as much support and encouragement as we can.

PRESIDENT MIKE SAYS 1990 A GOOD YEAR

As summer approaches, and (depending on where you are) takes over from a heady balmy spring, we can now look back on what will surely be remembered as the best ever seasons for the Lysaght Alpine Club.

First there was the snow itself - for many of our members and lodge guests, 1990 was blessed with the best skiing conditions they can remember, with 1981 being the last "really good" season. Snow drifts around Illabunda were the deepest we have seen at our new lodge, and quite heavy snow falls have continued quite regularly well into the spring. Let us hope for many more seasons like 1990.

Booking levels at the new Illabunda have always been high, but the superb skiing conditions this winter have led to record utilisation, and therefore, the club's financial results at the end of the year should reflect this high level of business. While our bed usage was up, skier numbers, at Perisher Valley at least, were obviously down in 1990, no doubt contributed to by excessive lift ticket prices and competition from the much improved Thredbo resort, and Mt. Blue Cow. During the season, I heard a statistic quoted by the Cooma visitors Centre, that park vesitors were down by 30% from the previous year. While this is bad news for the resort operators and other businesses in the snowfields, the reduced crowding was no doubt much welcomed by our members and guests!

Competition performance adds to the 1990 "good news" for Lysaght Alpine Club. For the second year in a row we won the coveted Brian Donegan Memorial Illawarra Interclub Races which are contested by the ski clubs based in the Wollong area. Congratulations to our team in that race meeting, and to all who competed for the club in our other "official" races, ie. the KAC-Martini Cross country Classic, the Perisher Cup/Plate, and our Junior Championchips. Special mention to Helmut Zeller, whose performance in the Perisher Cup earned him the Club Champion's trophy for 1990.

Lodge managers, Alan and Alicia had another good year at Illabunda, and almost everyone will be pleased that they have accepted the job again for 1991. In the meantime, Alan & Alicia will again spend our summer enjoying winter and skiing in Andorra.

I mentioned some difficulties in lodge operations in the last President's Message. Another potentially serious one that I must bring up involves lodge security: apparently some members have been revealing the access code to the "void" to their friends. Obviously there has been no ill intent, but it must be emphasised that, in consideration of the valuable equipment owned by members and the club, and stored in the void, that only full members are allowed to have access code information - a reasonable

extention of this is to the immediate families of members, but no further. Also, for obvious reasons, the access codes for the external doors must never be spread beyond full members and legitimate guests at the lodge. Please, your cooperation in ensuring our security.

To finish this message, let me thank all members and others who helped run the Club and Lodge through 1990. Of course there's the club committee and the office bearers, but I'm also talking about those who help in other ways at working bees, as Lodge Captains etc. Your contributions ars most appreciated - thanks to you all. Don't forget - in December, I'll circulate the annual Debenture Poll questionnaire, and also a request for your opinion on that most hotly debated topic, smoking in the Lodge.
