#### Really Fit Champions

As a group, skiers are probably fitter than most, but how do you think you compare? Frank and Jane Zeller are both former ACT Triathletes of the Year, and competed in March in the Forster Ironman event which involves 3.8 km swimming, 180.2 km cycling, and 42.2 km running. Frank took 9 hours 34 minutes and Jane 10 hours 28 minutes. These times qualified them to be among 75 Australians, many of whom are professionals, selected to contest the Hawaii Ironman on October 15. Frank and Jane will travel to Hawaii on October 1 to acclimatize to the 35 to 38 degree heat and 80 percent humidity. Their training involves a couple of hours each day plus a 6 - 7 hour bike ride on Saturdays, and a 2 - 3 hour run on Sundays.

The Hawaii Ironman is the pinnacle of Ironman Racing in the world, and you may be able to see it on your TV. If it is, make sure you watch for Frank and Jane and give them a cheer.

I remember some years ago when I gave Jane inspiration to do well in the Martini Rossi. It was my best finish, 52 minutes. It was her first try at cross country skiing and she was tiring badly over the last kilometer, which was a climb up the road behind Charlotte's. I caught up to and passed her about 200m from the finish and all I said to her was "I can't let a mere woman beat me"! Wow! She took off like a rocket, and has gone like one ever since.

## Crazy Man

Did you watch the DASH for CASH on TV in August? If you did you undoubtedly saw Ben Salon competing. He did not get to the money first but said this year was for the experience. In mid-August the Cross Country race week saw our club yery successful, again.

The Perisher Valley X-C Night Relay involved approx. 50 teams, including many of the past and present National Ski Teams. The race started at 6.30pm and involved 4 X 2km circuits. The Lysaght Alpine Club team of Lucas Molloy, Christeen Clifton, Helmut Zeller, and Friedl Bartsch CAME SECOND in a very close result.

The Martini Rossi from Perisher to Charlotte's Pass was held in beautiful sunny, calm weather, and was a delight to race in. The result was also a delight with Lysaght Alpine Club getting a 4th out of over 450 racers. The winner was a world class racer from Switzerland. and our own Lucas Molloy came 4th (1 minute behind the winner), and was the best NSW racer. Other Club members all performed well and included in order of finishing, Frank Zeller (only 4 minutes behind the winner), Friedl Bartsch, Helmut Zeller, Rodrigo Torres (15 min better than last year), Belinda Arnold, Noel Arnold, and Betty Arnold. Noel and Betty are again the club veteran X-C Champions. Surely we don't have to wait another 32 years until Lucas is over 55 to find someone to beat them? Unfortunately we were 2 short of the 10 racers needed to get a banner.

There was also an epicure night X-C race involving 3 lodges and finishing at the Sundeck bout 10.30pm.

In the Paddy Pallin, Friedl came in 14th out of about 150 racers.

In the Inter Club Races, Lysaght Alpine scooped the pool being team winners in the Alpine, XC, and Combined events. In the XC Lucas Molloy was 1st, and Friedl Bartsch 3rd. In the Alpine Graeme Williams was 1st and Ben Salon 3rd, and one of our young up and coming racers Caneron Nell was 5th. Watch for Cameron's name in future years. In the Men's Combined results, Helmut Zeller was 2nd and Ben Salon 3rd.

Late in August Lucas Molloy competed in the Australian XC Classic events and came 7th in the 15k and 9th in the 20k races.

As I said earlier, we can all be proud to be members of our club, but we should also be proud of our racers. On behalf of all our members I congratulate them, those who achieved top results and those who competed.
